Answer

In the name of Allah, Most Gracious, Most Merciful

Assalaamu `alaykum waRahmatullahi Wabarakatuh

In brief, *zak?h* is one of the five pillars of Isl?m and a means to cleanse one's wealth. For those who possess *nis?b*, it is an obligation to pay 2.5% of their wealth, minus any expenses due, at the end of each lunar year. *Zak?h* has to be given in the ownership of needy Muslims who are non-Sayyids (those from the Ban? H?shim lineage).

On the other hand, *sadaqah* is any amount of money donated for the pleasure of All?h and intended for the poor. However, the term *sadaqah* also applies to

money donated for any noble cause, as well. It is not necessary to give *sadaqah* in the ownership of the poor and both, Sayyids and non-Sayyids, are valid recipients of it.

As for *lill?h*, it simply means "for [the pleasure of] All?h." It is any good act done with the intention of seeking the pleasure of All?h Ta'?l?.
